Dear Parishioners and Friends of the Catholic Parishes of Western Holt and Boyd Counties,

Happy New Year! My prayer as we begin 2023 is this may be a year filled with blessings for all of us!

As most of you already know Deacon Roger Filips and his wife Ann have moved into our parishes and Deacon Filips has requested that the archbishop transfer his assignment from Holy Trinity parish — Hartington and St. Michael parish — Coleridge to our family of parishes. Welcome Roger and Ann! (Enjoy the sun and the beach the next couple of months, we'll be ready to put you to work when you return!)

As you are also aware, the past several months the Pastoral Planning Team and I worked diligently to develop a pastoral planning document that was sent to the archbishop on November 15th. On November 29th, I received "Tentative Approval" of our plan from the archbishop. This essentially means that he's not making us go back to the drawing board. The only immediate change for us is that we will cease having weekend Masses at Assumption of the Blessed Virgin Catholic Church in Lynch. We will continue to have a weekday Mass twice a month (so that the Blessed Sacrament can continue to be reserved there.) We will also still have baptisms, weddings and funerals for the Sacred Heart Boyd County parishioners who wish to have those liturgies at Assumption.

I am very much aware that that news was very difficult and painful for those who call "Assumption" home. Unfortunately, it is the current reality we live in and we quite honestly fared much better than some of the families of parishes to the east of us. Please pray for the folks at Assumption as they grieve the loss of worshiping in their home church during the coming months.

The archbishop has also asked us to continue our conversations about what we can do to engage our schools in becoming more "missional" in the coming years and to further explore areas we can work together on this. He asked as well that we continue to explore ways to centralize our business office (Much of that has already been done and was outlined in the proposal that he has given tentative approval too.) Some of the things he's asking us to explore are centralized purchasing of some supplies (such as paper) so that we can get more product for our dollars.

Again, all in all we fared well. Pray also for those families of parishes who are struggling to accept the present reality, that the Holy Spirit may move them to a place of peace and grant them the wisdom to find ways to continue the mission of Jesus.

Thank you to all who participated in our pastoral planning meetings your input was important to creating the final document. I will likely be calling a few more meetings before we reach the end of this planning phase.

MINISTRY OF PRAISE—A WORD FROM DEACON FILIPS

January 2023

For many people, if they don't get anything out of the homily, they feel like the entire Mass was a waste of time. This frequently happens to young people and others who have not entered deeply into their faith yet. In fact, I think this is a good diagnostic test: If you feel like you never got anything out of a Mass where the homily limped, (and all of them do sometimes), my assumption would be that you do not yet understand what is actually happening during Mass, because the homily is only the third most important part of the Mass.

The second most important part of Mass is the reading of the scriptures. The actual word of God coming to us directly, speaking to us in our present situation. If you are not getting much out of the scripture readings either, I recommend reading and meditating on them quietly before or after Mass, so when you hear the words proclaimed, they can resonate more deeply in you. Use the WRAP or Lectio Divina method that is taught in small groups. I would be happy to meet with anyone who would like to learn this ancient method of communicating with God.

The most important part of the Mass is the Eucharist, where Jesus is made physically present, by the power of the priesthood, from the bread and the wine. Jesus and His suffering is then offered to the Father as the perfect sacrifice for our sins; we are encouraged to join our sufferings to Jesus' passion to be offered to the Father our salvation and the salvation of the world. Then we eat the flesh and blood of Jesus at communion to nourish and strengthen us and to change us, so we become ready for heaven. (Yes, Jesus' body and blood are both present in the host, you do not have to receive from the cup to get that benefit.)

The truth about the Mass is so amazing that I beg you to watch a short little video on You Tube called "The Veil Removed". It is only 8 minutes long, but it shows beautifully and powerfully what happens at the Mass. Normally it is like there is a translucent veil in front of the altar. You can sort of see what is going on, but not really. At every Mass, Jesus and the saints and angels are at the altar, that is why it is such a privilege to serve at a Mass. And if we can see with the eyes of faith, it is all visible to us. "The Veil Removed" movie uses modern special effects to show what would happen if the veil were removed and we could actually see it happening. It should be mandatory viewing for all Catholics. There is so much happening in that 8-minute movie that you need to watch it twice to catch it all.

A famous recent study showed that less than 1/3 of Catholics believe in the real presence of Jesus in the Eucharist. This shocked our bishops and showed what we have lost from our faith, so now we are in the first year of a three-year Eucharistic Revival effort. As Dr. Scott Hahn says "If the Eucharist is just a meal, then Calvary is just an execution," and that would be our tragedy.

This short film is a good tool for Eucharistic Revival that you can do with your family; Go to You Tube and watch "The Veil Removed" I strongly urge you to watch this free movie and discuss it with your family, then join or start a small group to grow closer to Jesus and pray for the success of the Eucharistic Revival. The reverse begins the chapter on spirituality from my book "Pearls of the Universal Church" (Available on Amazon and Gloria Deo Bookstores!)

Spirituality grows the soul. Religion is what our body does. Spirituality and religion work together because we have both a soul and a body (see CCC 362).

Many people today say they are "spiritual not religious." This is nonsense! These people are lazy and adolescent. For the soul to express itself, it needs religion. Spirituality without religion is like a gaseous vapor. It has no form and can mean anything to anybody. It usually means "I appreciate that God created this wonderful life for me, but I am too lazy to get out of bed and go to Church to worship my creator!" Or it reveals that the person has rejected Christianity and has fallen into the error and sin of worshipping a pagan god such as "mother earth" or practicing New Age or Eastern spirituality.

THERE ARE SIMILAR STAGES OF FRIENDSHIP WITH A HUMAN AND WITH GOD:

1. Meet a friend — Meet God.
2. Doing things together — Invite God into our lives through study, prayer, scripture, and the rosary.
3. Just hang out together — Eucharistic adoration.
4. Trust - It is more than mental. We can feel it. We begin to share more deeply with both friends and God.
5. Gift exchange — We give our time, talents, and treasure as a sign of the mutual sharing of selves with a friend or God.
6. Commitment — No more fear. Expectations are raised. Trust is exchanged.
7. Sacrifice — We give willingly for the other person. We donate time, talent, and treasure to His Church.
8. We are willing to die for the other person — Jesus died for us. Martyrs die for Him. Soldiers don't charge into a machine gun nest for the medals or because they are told to do it. They do it to save their friends who are being killed by the machine gun. Jesus charged into the sin to destroy it because it was killing us.


The photos above are from three of St. Patrick's Religious Education families. They designed their family Advent wreath using the Advent Kit that they purchased.


