simple and joyful life. Through the prayers

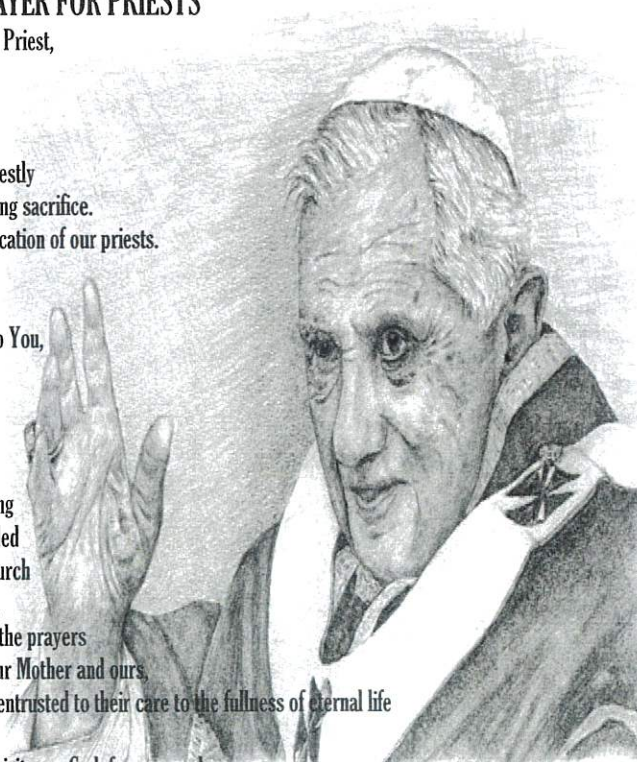

The Necessity of Work and Leisure

Greetings fellow Prayer Warriors!

My recent retirement has caused me to think about the role of work and leisure in God's plan for us. The first thing to know is that God is a worker. In the Bible we read how He created the universe and holds it in existence by His force of will. St. Paul (Philippians 2;13) says that God continues to work in our lives to shape and mold us into what He wants us to be. He did not just create the universe, wind it up, and let things play out randomly. He is an ongoing presence in our lives, slowly influencing and shaping us to become more holy so we can come live with Him forever in Heaven.

Because we are made in the image and likeness of God, we are also called to be workers. Adam, and we, are called to till and keep the earth. Notice that God told Adam to till and keep the earth when he was first placed in the Garden of Eden before the fall. Work was God's way of letting Adam share in His work of creation as a partner of God, it was not a punishment for Adam's fall. After the fall, however, is the first mention of toil and sweat, thorns and thistles, which is often how we experience our work now, but work is still honorable and good and makes us more like God and more ready to be with Him in heaven. There is more honor in being a good burger flipper than in being the world champion video game player!

So, what to make of leisure? God also rested after his labors. "So God blessed the seventh day and hallowed it, because on it God rested from all His work which he had done in creation." (Gen 2;3) You see, God works, man works, but beasts of burden also work. It is our sabbath day of rest that makes us different from a mule or horse. Man needs to work but he also needs a time for rest, leisure, and spending time with his creator. This is what makes us most fully human and most fully God-like (ready for heaven).

What about retirement? Does this mean our lives no longer have meaning? Are we no longer partners of God in His creation? Does this halt our progress toward salvation? No. "To everything there is a season, a time for every purpose under the heaven." (Eccles 3;1) There is a time to grow and learn, a time to work and till the earth, and a time to rest from those labors in retirement. The timing of retirement is individual, depending on finances, health, family situation, enjoyment of work etc., but we shouldn't feel guilty about retiring.

If we are able-bodied retirement does not mean sitting on the couch all day. This is the ideal time to take care of those things that we neglected when working. We can strengthen family bonds, take up a new spiritual discipline, and serve our communities. We also need to use this time to grow in our relationship with God because what comes next is decline, death, and judgement, and then it is too late to do anything to improve our chances of going to heaven.

Let's all pray that workers earn a just wage, and rest and worship God on Sundays, and all retirees find meaning and purpose in their retirement. Below continues my chapter on spirituality in "Pearls of the Universal Church" available through www.spiritualworkspress.com

WHAT DOES THE VOICE OF GOD SOUND LIKE?

1. It can be difficult to tell if that voice in your head is from God or Satan or just your own imagination. This guide will help to sort out Satan's voice from God's voice. First notice the characteristics:

God's voice

Stills you
Leads you
Reassures you.
Enlightens you.
Encourages you.
Comforts you.
Calms you.
Convicts you.
Causes gratitude

Rushes you
Pushes you
Frightens you
Confuses you
Discourages you
Worries you
Obsesses you

Causes fear

2. Next, sort out your own thoughts and imagination by slowing down and taking time. Our imagination and obsessions move on to other things after time. If God is trying to get through to you, He will persist. Your father might have told you to never make a big decision without sleeping on it. I recommend sleeping and praying on it for weeks. Always give God time to answer. He answers in His own time, not ours.

3. Never ask God a multiple-choice question, only True or False. We can only understand simple answers from God. Instead of asking if you should become firemen, policeman, cowboy, or a Priest, focus on one of these, and ask God if you should become a fireman, yes or no. If the answer is yes or true, you will feel peace, reassurance, comfort, calm. If the answer is no or false you will feel worried, fearful, restless etc.

4. Find a place of peace and quiet so you can hear God over all the noise of the world. An hour of adoration with a yearly 3-day silent retreat works great.

5. Ask an advisor or friend experienced in the ways of God. Outside advice can help to clarify a confused mind. A good alternative is to join a small prayer/bible study group so you can run your thoughts and ideas past someone else.

10 Guidelines

From: God

To: All His Children

Effective Immediately:

Please be aware that there are changes you need to make in your life. These changes need to be completed in order that I may fulfill my promises to you to grant you peace, joy and happiness in this life. I apologize for any inconvenience, but after all that I am doing, this seems very little to ask of you. I know, I already gave you 10 Commandments. Keep them, but follow these guidelines as well.

1. QUIT WORRYING

Life has dealt you a blow and all you do is sit and worry. Have you forgotten that I am here to take all your burdens and carry them for you? Or do you just enjoy fretting over every little thing that comes your way?

2. PUT IT ON THE LIST

Something needs done or taken care of. Put it on the list. No, not YOUR list. Put it on MY to-do-list. Let ME be the one to take care of the problem. I can't help you until you turn it over to me. And, although my to-do-list is long, I am, after all, God. I can take care of anything you put into my hands. In fact, if the truth were ever really known, I take care of a lot of things for you that you never even realize.

3. TRUST ME

Once you've given your burdens to me, quit trying to take them back. Trust in me. Have the faith that I will take care of all your needs, your problems and your trials. Problems with the kids? Put them on my list. Problem with finances? Put it on my list. Problems with your emotional roller coaster? For my sake, put it on my list. I want to help you. All you have to do is ask.

4. LEAVE IT ALONE

Don't wake up one morning and say, "Well, I'm feeling much stronger now, I think I can handle it from here." Why do you think you are feeling stronger now? It's simple. You gave me your burdens, and I'm taking care of them. I also renew your strength and cover you in my peace. Don't you know that if I give you these problems back, you will be right back where you started? Leave them with me and forget about them. Just let me do my job.

5. TALK TO ME

I want you to forget a lot of things. Forget what was making you crazy. Forget the worry and the fretting because you know I'm in control. But there's one thing I want you to never forget. Please don't forget to talk to me - OFTEN! I love you. I want to hear your voice. I want you to include me in the things going on in your life. I want to hear you talk about your friends and family. 6. HAVE FAITH

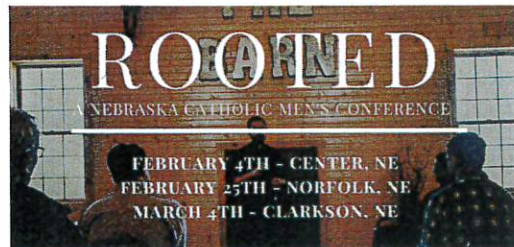
