FROM THE DESK OF FATHER STARMAN—

Dear Parishioners and Friends of the Catholic Parishes of Western Holt and Boyd Counties,

The gospel we hear this weekend (John 17:1-11a), is the prayer that Jesus offers for his disciples before he is arrested in the Garden of Gethsemane, Jesus clearly and concisely summarizes the mission that was his to fulfill on earth: that all people would have eternal life, hear and accept God's word, and remember that they belong to God. Perhaps it was that clarity of vision that gave him the strength to see the mission through to it divine conclusion – from arduous passion to painful death to glorious resurrection. This gospel can remind us that fruitful work is done with intention and integrity. As believers we are called to continue God's mission, we will find direction when we are lost and strength when we are weary by keeping our eyes fixed on the ultimate goal. But what can we do to stay focused and attuned to God's will?

We hear throughout Scripture how Jesus remained connected to the Creator and his earthly mission through prayer, retreat, and ritual. There are many examples of Jesus praying, including John 11: 41-42 where Jesus prays before raising Lazarus from the dead. In that instance Jesus thanks God for listening to his words and acknowledges that God is always listening. Do we trust that God is always with us during our life journey? Do we testify to that belief through our words and actions?

Jesus also to time to retreat, to withdraw to private places for renewal and rest. In these moments, Jesus had experiences that clarified his vision. Consider the forty days Jesus spent fasting in the desert. During that time. Satan tempted lesus with offers of wealth and power and tried to persuade Jesus to test God. The temptations Jesus faced are also placed before us in our day-to-day lives. How often are we tempted to sacrifice our integrity, our principles, or our welfare in exchange for some financial reward? How often do we see political parties compromise on deeply held principles out of fear that they will lose votes at the ballot box and seats at the tables where decisions are made? When we follow lesus's example of undertaking spiritual retreats, we give ourselves the opportunity to reorient our hearts and realign our will so that both are more closely linked with God.

Jesus also demonstrated for us the power of shared ritual. An observant Jewish man, Jesus participated in the celebrations and high holy days of his ancestors. At the Last Supper, Jesus celebrated the Passover meal with his disciples. Through the washing of feet and the breaking of the bread, Jesus taught the disciples how ritual can express not just devotion and submission to God, but also abiding care for the sisters and brothers who walk through life with us every day.

How do we uniquely celebrate, remember, or show honor? In what ways does a retreat into our inner selves provide relief from the world and rest in God? Let us use this season to pause, seek opportunity for retreat, and grow closer to God through the example of Jesus. In our mission to bring about the kingdom of God, let us focus our vision on the Divine and grow in trust each step of the way.
